The Madison Avenue eastbound I-80 project was substantially complete by mid-2024. The construction crew mainly focused on bridge demolitions and rebuilding I-80 westbound. Reconstruction of Madison Avenue was nearly complete by the end of 2024.

Long-Term Strategy

Program construction started in 2008 and is expected to continue through 2026. Approximately 97% of Program construction has been completed. Projects were grouped strategically to maximize improvements while minimizing construction impacts to Council Bluffs residents and the traveling public. All projects were bid and awarded by year-end 2023.
